Make sure your essay fits the theme
The theme of your essay is almost always determined by the purpose of the award, or why the organization is giving away the money

Answer the underlying questions
Use the essay question as a way to show the scholarship committee
they you are the best candidate.

Share a slice of your life
In other words, don't try to explain everything. Focus on one aspect of
your life. By doing this, you are providing an example of who you are.

Keep it descriptive and concise

Use the "show, don't tell" method to illustrate your point. This helps keep your writing interesting and descriptive.
