


Celebrate Black Voices






Chinese/Lunar New Year Celebration Saturday, February 17 from 2 to 4 p.m. **Ironwood Library**

Services Bill all year long. Why? Because every year, Phoenix Water calculates your sewer fee based on your water consumption in January, February, and March. Since residents typically use less water outside in the winter, your monthly sewer fee is calculated based on your average water use in those three months.
