

The City of Phoenix has teamed up with Mill and R.City to prevent food waste. City Hall is using 25 Mill food recyclers in breakrooms throughout the building. These recyclers turn kitchen scraps and



local farms.

leftovers into nutrient-rich food grounds that are later turned into compost for local farms. Now Phoenix residents have a chance to try Mill at home and get a farm-fresh box of produce in return! If you join Mill, you'll get either a box of farm produce or a bag of compost every quarter.

Mill's food recyclers are no larger than a typical kitchen trash can. They accept fruits, vegetables, grains/breads, meat, eggshells, and more. They work automatically while you sleep to turn the food scraps into grounds. The recycler takes weeks to fill up, and has state-of-the-art odor filtration to keep your kitchen stink-free. Every month, R.City collects
